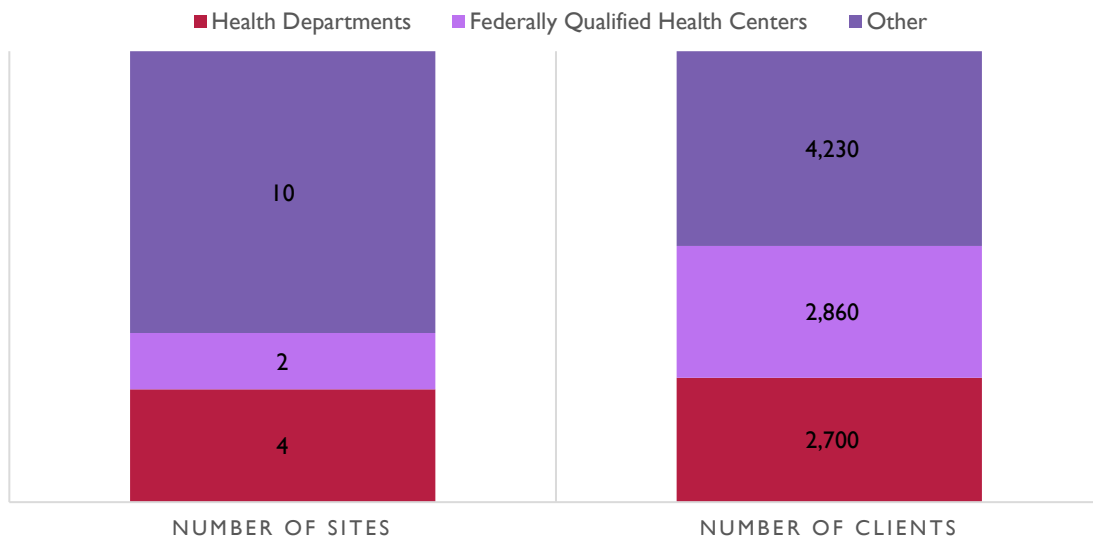


Title X in Wyoming

In Wyoming in 2015, there were **16** Title X–funded sites operated by different types of agencies. Collectively these Title X–funded sites delivered contraceptive care to **9,790** women in Wyoming.

TITLE X-FUNDED SITES AND CLIENTS SERVED IN WYOMING BY AGENCY TYPE



	% of Total Sites	% of Total Clients
Health Departments	25%	28%
Federally Qualified Health Centers	13%	29%
Other	63%	43%

In 2015, Title X–supported contraceptive services helped Wyoming women to **prevent 2,100 unintended pregnancies and 700 abortions**. Title X–funded sites in Wyoming delivered contraceptive care to 2,280 female adolescent clients (under age 20), helping them to prevent **600 unintended pregnancies and 200 abortions**.

IMPACT OF POTENTIAL THREATS TO TITLE X IN WYOMING

If all Title X funds were redirected only to federally qualified health center sites that serve at least 10 contraceptive clients a year in Wyoming, those sites would have to **at least double their contraceptive client caseloads** to maintain the current reach of Title X.
